Tentative Decisions for February 4, 2026

FL-07-00169 Simunovich, Judith A. vs. Simunovich, Dennis M.

Petitioner's Request for Orders Determining Spousal Support Arrears and Attorneys' Fees are GRANTED. The Court finds that Respondent owes Petitioner the principal amount of \$77,600 plus \$31,687 in accrued interest for a total of \$109,287.00. Respondent is ordered to pay the overdue amounts within 30 days after service of the Order After Hearing.

Respondent is ordered to pay Petitioner \$5,500 in attorney's fees and costs within 30 days after service of the Order After Hearing, which can be recorded as a separate Abstract of Judgment if not timely paid. An award of attorney's fees and costs is appropriate because there is a demonstrated disparity between the parties in access to funds to retain or maintain counsel and in the ability to pay for legal representation. The party requested to pay attorney's fees has or is likely to have the ability to pay for legal representation for both sides. The requested attorney's fees and costs are reasonable and necessary.

Respondent is ordered to provide his driver's license number and last four digits of his social security number to Petitioner's attorney for use on any Abstract of Judgment(s) that will be recorded if arrears and/or attorneys fees and costs are not timely paid in full.

FL-18-00266 Rogers, Ashley Rose vs. Davila, Adolfo

Respondent is ordered to pay Petitioner \$7,853.73 in attorney's fees and costs within 90 days after service of the Order After Hearing, which can be recorded as a separate Abstract of Judgment if not timely paid. An award of attorney's fees and costs is appropriate because

there is a demonstrated disparity between the parties in access to funds to retain or maintain counsel and in the ability to pay for legal representation. FL-22-00016 Cabibi, Shalynn C vs. Cabibi, Joseph Patrick

Petitioner's Request for Order waiving Petitioner's Preliminary Financial Disclosure is GRANTED.

FL-22-00183 Navarro, Ernesto vs. Navarro, Cassandra

Petitioner's Request for Order filed December 19, 2025 is DENIED in its entirety. Petitioner has presented no new facts regarding spousal support, which was reserved for later adjudication. Petitioner presented no evidence of the existence as to the alleged annuity in Respondent's name, which Respondent addressed and denied the existence of an annuity in her name. The existence of the annuity was addressed at trial and was taken into consideration in dividing assets. As to judgment, the parties entered into judgment regarding the dissolution of their marriage on June 5, 2024 and a judgment to that effect was filed on September 3, 2024.

FL-22-00237 Cann, Courtne vs. Cann, Sean

Petitioner's Request for Order waiving Respondent's Preliminary Financial Disclosure is GRANTED.

FL-23-00107 Moisa, Michael Jr vs. Banuelos, Anissa

Respondent's Request for Order filed on October 2, 2025 is DENIED without prejudice due to Respondent's failure to prosecute the matter. Respondent has failed to serve Petitioner with notice of the Request for Order.

FL-24-00024 Reynoso, Elsa vs. Flores, Fernando

Petitioner's Request for Order filed December 8, 2025 is DENIED without prejudice due to Petitioner failing to file a proof of service indicating Respondent was properly noticed of the hearing.

FL-24-00164 **Fritzler, Sherrill vs. Fritzler, Mike**

The Court GRANTS Respondent's Motion to Set Aside Judgment pursuant to Code of Civil Procedure section 473 and Family Code section 2121, finding that the facts alleged, including the traumatic brain injury that has impaired Respondent's processing, thinking and memory, as the grounds for relief materially affected the original outcome and that the moving party would materially benefit from the granting of the relief. Respondent is to file the responsive pleading forthwith. As a result, Petitioner's Request to Enforce Judgment is DENIED.

FL-24-00216 **Rivera Flores, Carla Jose vs. Bonilla Otero, Samuel Elias**

Petitioner's Request for Order waiving Respondent's Preliminary Financial Disclosure is GRANTED.

FL-25-00012 **Medina, Maria Sonia vs. Muniz, Roberto Carlos**

Petitioner's Request for Order waiving Respondent's Preliminary Financial Disclosure is GRANTED.

FL-25-00176 **Renteria Ruelas, Ana Isabel vs. Fernandez, Ezekiel**

Petitioner's Request for Order waiving Respondent's Preliminary Financial Disclosure is GRANTED.
